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Dear Parents



Welcome back! We hope that you all had a lovely holiday and a well-deserved break! We are looking forward to having an amazing spring term!

The children have become really good at knowing where to put their things in the morning and to put their belonging on their named pegs. This term we are going to focus on encouraging the children to put on their own coats and to do their coats up too, as well as independently getting changed for PE. It would be really helpful if the children could practice this at home too please.

Please can you also continue to bring in a pair of wellies for the children to wear whilst in the wildlife area, we can keep these at school or you are welcome to take them home at the end of each day. We do have lots of spare wellies too, so please don't worry if you are unable to do this.

This term, as we have now settled into our daily routines, we will have a big focus on being kind to each other and how we respect one another and each other's feelings.

Our main focus for English will be following our 'Talk for Writing' scheme and looking at the book 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. We introduce our new Phonics scheme 'Soundwrite' last term, so we shall continue to focus on this on a daily basis throughout the year. We will be looking at writing simple sentences and continue to practice writing different CVC words.

In Geography we will be looking at the topic 'Around the World', where we get to meet our favourite bear, Barnaby! In science we will be looking at 'Seasonal changes', and we will use this topic to explore our wildlife area. We will be using our music scheme 'Charanga' and looking at the unit 'Our World'.

Fieldmice will be now doing PE on Wednesday this term, the children usually bring their PE kits in at the start of term and keep them at school on their pegs until the end of term. Please make sure that all PE kit is clearly named and that the children know where their names are placed.
