

Year 1/2 Knowledge Organiser: At the Farm




Arable - grows crops in their fields

The Farm	
<p>Buildings</p> <p>A farm has lots of different buildings including barns, a hen house, a pig sty, a farmhouse, a farm shop and an office.</p>	<p>Animals</p> <p>You might see cows, chickens, sheep, pigs, goats and horses on a farm.</p>
<p>Seasons</p>	<p>Food and Crops</p> <p>Farms are very important because they provide us with a lot of the food we eat. e.g., eggs, milk, yoghurt, cheese, meat, vegetables and bread.</p>
	<p>Clothes</p> <p>At the farm you will need to wear clothes such as boots, coats and maybe even gloves when you are handling the animals.</p>

KEY VOCABULARY	
Farm	A farm is an area of land, together with the buildings on it, that is used for growing crops or raising animals,
Countryside	The countryside is land which is away from towns and cities.
Town	A town is a place with many streets and buildings, where people live and work. Towns are larger than villages and smaller than cities.
Seasons	The seasons are the main periods into which a year can be divided and which each have their own typical weather conditions.
Months	A month is one of the twelve periods of time that a year is divided into, for example January or February.
Compass	A compass is an instrument that you use for finding directions. It has a dial and a magnetic needle that always points to the north.
Barn	A barn is a building on a farm in which crops or animal food can be kept.
Farmhouse	A farmhouse is the main house on a farm, usually where the farmer lives.
Office	An office is a room or a part of a building where people work sitting at desks.
Direction	A direction is the general line that someone or something is moving or pointing in.
