KEY VOCABULARY

Rural	Areas which are not towns or cities. They are often farming or agricultural areas. These areas are sometimes called "the country" or "countryside".
Countryside	The countryside is land which is away from towns and cities.
Town	A town is a place with many streets and buildings, where people live and work. Towns are larger than villages and smaller than cities.
Urban	An urban area is an area where many people live and work close together. The population is higher than in the surrounding area. It is where buildings are close together. Urban is the opposite of rural. Urban areas are usually cities and towns.
My address	The place where I live.
Neighbourhood	The area around your home.
Terraced house	A house joined to another house on both sides
Semi-detached house	A house joined to another house on one side.
Detached house	A house not joined to another house.
Bungalow	A house which has only one storey (no upstairs).
